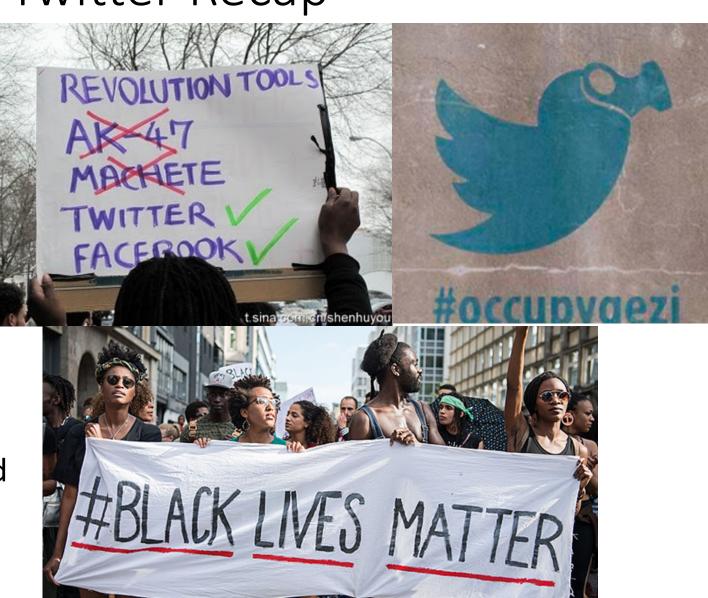

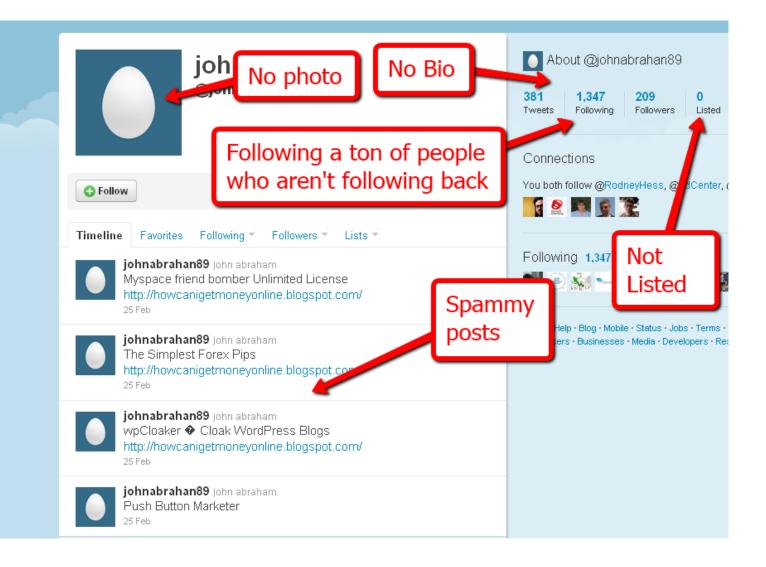

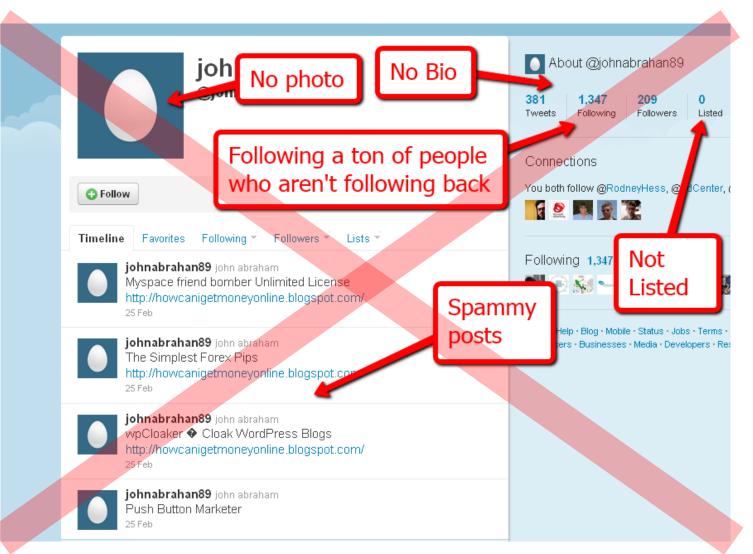

- Astroturfing: as though starts from people
  - Paid online reviewers

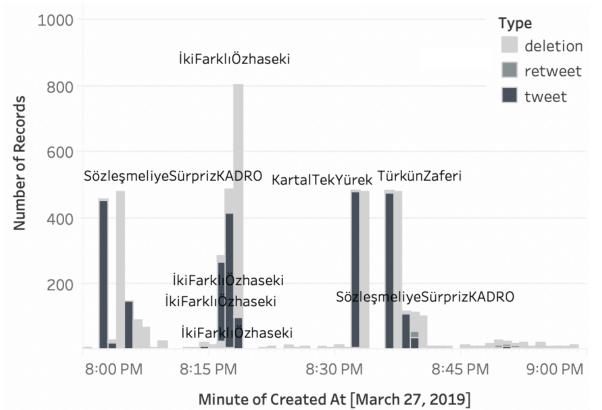








## The Trick: Rapid Deletions



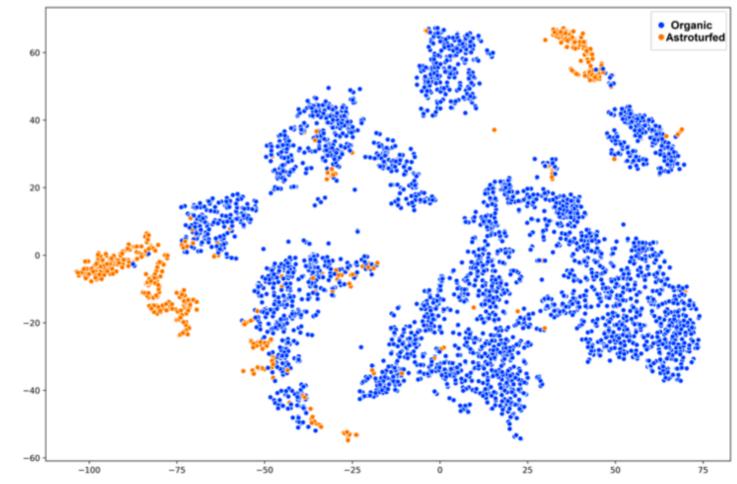
- Very hard to detect!
  - The owners of the accounts are unaware or they think it is a virus
  - Researchers are unaware because deletions are only visible
    - when you track specific users (biased)
    - get 1% of all tweets (very low recall)

#### Investigation

- Went through 1% of all tweets (Freely available in archive.org)
- Only Turkish case found
  - Saudi Arabia and Korea has astroturfed trends too, but not many deletions
- Rule based classification
  - Classify tweet with random words based on rules
  - Many tweet with random words
    - Have the same keyword
    - Created in small time frame (3 minutes)
    - Deleted in small time frame (3 minutes)
  - => Astroturfing
- Problem: Adversaries can change the content and evade rules.

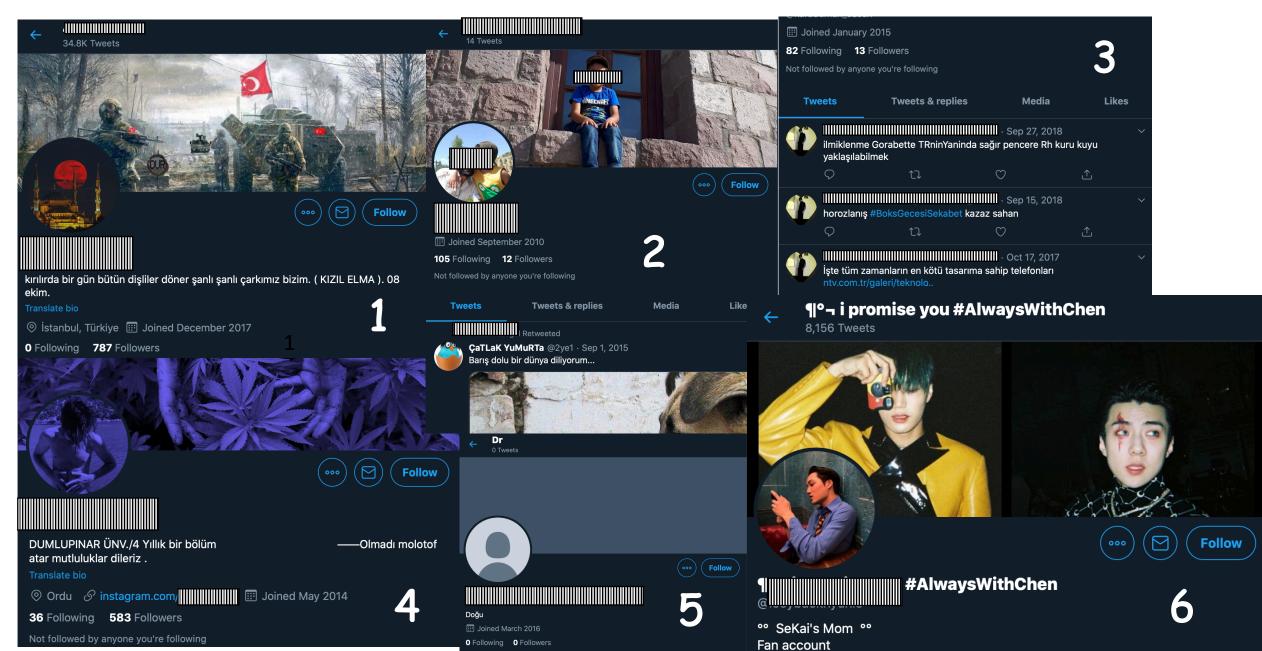
### ML Based Content Free Classification

- 2 Months of trend & tweets
  - 2000 astroturfed
  - 600 astroturfed trends
  - 1% of all Twitter tweets
- ML based classification
  - Deletion count
  - Geotagged tweet count
  - Unique geolocations
  - Unique screen name
  - Retweet count
  - Url count
  - Mention count
  - Hashtag in a tweet count

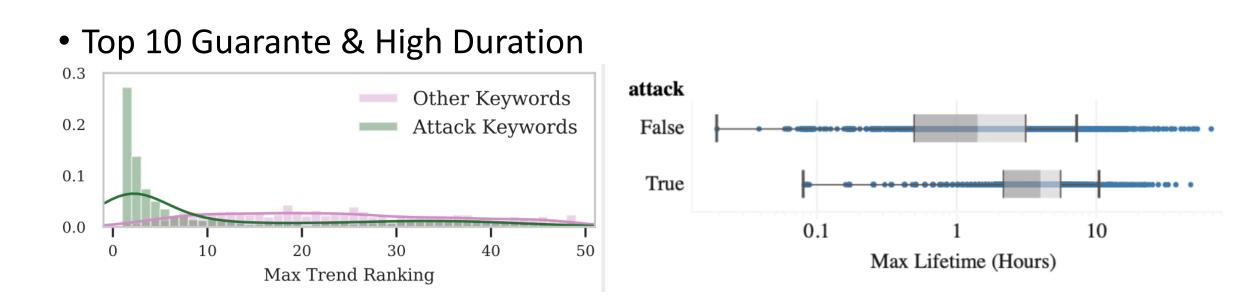


TSNE plot of trends Neural network, Prec: 95%, Rec: 91.7%

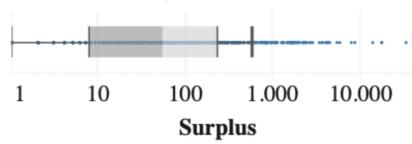

#### What are the Trends About?

- Ads: «Gambling, buy fake followers, tv series»
- Appeals to Government: »We want jobs»
- Election Campaign: «Vote for x»
- Fun: «Galatasaray is the best»
- Disinformation: «Erdoğan is the best.»
